exe or .mdb files while installing your application. The package contains a right and .exe file. Wigan Hall (Wigan) Wigan Hall was a pleasure ground in Wigan, Greater Manchester, England. It was one of the few remaining fragments of the once extensive open-air pleasure gardens of the 19th century. It existed from around 1830 to 1930. The area of ground is now occupied by the site of the Old Wigan Central Library (also known as the Grosvenor Memorial Library) and a small car park. History The pleasure ground of Wigan Hall was located in the back garden of Wigan House, at the corner of Medlock Street and Wigan High Street. The pleasure grounds were bought in 1830 by John Bolton, a native of Wigan who was head of Bolton's Stationery shop. John Bolton died in 1833 and ownership passed to his widow, Elizabeth. It was purchased by the Wigan District Council in 1898, becoming part of the Great Field Park which was in turn acquired by Lancashire County Council in 1933. The park was improved by the council, who installed a cricket pitch, bowling greens and tennis courts, also built a tennis pavilion in 1905, it still stands today. The park, with a rectangular layout, was centred on a large domed Victorian building, known as Wigan Hall, which was occupied by Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway and The Engineering Society. The ground was the first to be turned into a park by the council, with a small, enclosed cycle track. In 1920 the cycling track was replaced with a row of thirty three trees. The park remained open until 1930 when an enlarged tram stop was constructed in the centre of the park. Today The site of the pleasure garden is now occupied by the Old Wigan Central Library, which is at the northern end of the park and the southern end of a small car park. The library had been built in 1932, but was heavily damaged by bombs during World War Two and was later sold to the Wigan Borough Council in 1946. The library became part of the Grosvenor Memorial Library in 1998 and the ground is now occupied by the library as well as the car park.
